New officers took the oath of office, and were sworn in by Trustee Bob DeSORDO for the upcoming year, 2020.

Report of Committee(s):

<u>Pension Report</u> – by President VALDORA. Funding level for P&F is 78-80% at this time. We are waiting for the actuary to look at for COLA. Rate of return on the pension investments is currently 7%, but in reality is closer to 16.9%. The pension increase in the last payment was a mistake in withholding (Tax) from Treasury, and will be paid back in installments over the following months.

<u>Legislative Report</u> - by Bob DeSORDO. Murphy has released funds from the state. Personnel from the state are looking into the plan used by (State of) UTAH for outsourcing of medical to other states to save money (Investigation <u>ONLY</u>, at this time). Gov. MURPHY and Nancy PELOSI are at Camden Comm. Col. to push Medicare Prescription HR3. A bill is pending to for churches to arm one (1) member in attendance for security, allegedly a church member. Spirited discussion on all topics by membership in attendance. (Attached is pending legislative information concerning P&F Pensions)

<u>Old Business</u> – by Pres. Joseph VALDORA and Sgt@Arms Bill SEAMAN. Concerning Insurance to carry weapons for retired personnel... US Law Shield is not insurance, it provides legal representation for court action. A lawyer for Defense if you are charged with a weapons offense (Use or carry). President expounded on the what-ifs and hypotheticals, but at the end of the day, they do not supply money for lawsuits or fines, only legal defense.

<u>Round Table</u> – Guest Speaker Mark RAZZOLI, who is running against Rep Bonnie WATSON-COLEMAN (D). He is a retired Jersey City Detective, and currently an Old Bridge Councilman. He has sponsored legislation against "Sanctuary State" (NJ). He is for Deportation of Criminal illegals and promotes the safety of cities. Further, NJ officials are disregarding the "911 Commission Report", making it easier for (illegal) immigrants to obtain US identification. He considers himself a "Law Enforcement Candidate" and asked for our support. His brief talk as well received by the membership in attendance. A motion to endorse RAZZOLI made by Local 9. There was talk of one hundred percent (100%) state tax exemption for First responders Injured on Duty. Just mentioned and briefly discussed. No further information or particulars were given
